#### 3K SEPTEMBER NEWS

Our year began with lots of smiles, new adventures and a few tears shed missing mom and dad. The children have settled into a routine and are adjusting to three days of learning and fun.

Our first tasks were learning the expectations of our room as well as how to share, wait your turn, and being patient with 17 little ones in our class. We have been enjoying toys and activities in the room to help us learn and grow along with a variety of Centers. Each of the Centers are areas that provide a range of learning from pretend play, discovering colors and letters, developing fine motor skills, and a variety of opportunities to grow through play.

We have begun studying our letters with the help of our Letter Monster who only eats certain letters and Allie the Alligator, our class puppet and friend, whom the children adore. Storytime is a favorite with books like <u>Chica Chica Boom Boom</u>, <u>Brown Bear</u>, <u>Brown Bear</u>, <u>What Do You See</u>?, and <u>Don't Push the Button</u>.




We are learning that we have a superpower: The Power to Choose(P2C), and that by using that superpower we can determine how our day will turn out. Ask us about our friend Danny (from the book What Should Danny Do?)-we have been helping him make choices and seeing how they change his day.

Happy Autumn from Grades 3&4! Our "Be a Saint" featured Catholic Sprouts Saint for the month of September has been St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta. The challenges for the month with St. Mother Teresa: learn and pray the Fragrance Prayer, give to the poor, print & display "I thirst" below a crucifix, and begin each day with Jesus. Our Religion text, Our Life With Jesus, starts us at the beginning of the Bible in the book of Genesis and has us contemplating what Heaven is like. As in 1 Corinthians 2:9, "What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him." Although we know our ideas won't even come close to how amazing Heaven is, here are our thoughts: Heaven is...more beautiful than mac 'n cheese ~Evie, ...more fun than playing football ~Jacob, ...better than gymnastics ~Ruthie, ...sounds better than food ~Kash, ...sounds better than birds ~Memphis, ...happier than getting something you want for your birthday ~Sam.

Math 3 is solving situations involving repeated addition for an introduction to multiplication expressions. ELA 3/4 topics have involved the four types of sentences and the minimum requirements of a sentence. In Social Studies we have been preparing for our visit to the Little Red Schoolhouse with a variety of resources from the MCPL. For Reading, what else would we be reading but <u>Little House in the Big Woods</u> by Laura Ingalls Wilder?

Aside from looking forward to our visit to the Little Red Schoolhouse coming up this Friday, September 29, the 3/4 students have weekly events to look forward to. Tuesdays, we are happy to have Father Alan teach our Religion class. Sometimes we get a chance to share a few jokes. We might be able to supply Father with new material. Check with a 3/4 student sometime for the answers to: Why didn't the sun go to college? Who is the leader of school supplies? Which school do surfers go to? Which school supplies are tired? What did the little tree say to the big tree? Then on Wednesdays, we welcome the Kindergarten for reading time. We can read to them, and sometimes they can even read to us! Mrs. Werner even shared a cool app, Novel Effect, with us that has a library of books that inserts sound effects



# Hello from Art!

Well, our portfolio covers are done, now we just need to fill them with our beautiful art. The theme I chose for this year's portfolio covers is founded on the rock based on Matthew 7: 24-28 comparing the wise who build their house on the rock of our faith in Christ to the foolish who build their house on the shifting sand of our ever changing personal/worldly opinions. Students illustrated this concept by using one side of their portfolio to depict a mountain/rock theme and the other to depict a sand/beach theme. Each side also included the verse portion appropriate to the scene. It's always a delight to see how different individuals interpret the same source verse in their own unique ways.

enjoy looking at the many shells and rocks I brought in for them to mark the color-coded faces helping them to see a relationship between COLOR and MOOD. doing each day is to have them indicate it on a chart I provided (example below). Students put a rock or shell on the picture of choice for the day. I think they sour art differs because of our feelings, and this can be expressed in the colors we choose. One way for me to be more aware of how students are My hope is these shells and rocks, small bits of God's creation, also remind students of our theme throughout the year. Fall is a time for bird migration. Using a paper plate as a pattern template, students dripped or drew their choice colors onto the flat(ish) SHAPE of the plate then cut out the wings and body of the bird. Once dry, these were assembled into a 3D bird FORM. Birds too can remind us of God's provision and love: Look at the birds of the air, that they do not sow, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth much more than they? Matthew 6:26. Check out this fun flock:
