#### **NOVEMBER 3K NEWS**

Our month began with a new skill...cutting with scissors. The children were pretty excited to be able to cut paper and worked really hard at it. Their first project was cutting strips of paper which were turned into the spots on their giraffe's made from the letter "G". They also fine tuned their gluing skills putting the spots on their giraffe's. Believe me, those spots are not going to fall off! Our little artists then added the eyes and mouth and the giraffes were proudly displayed in our room. I have included a picture for you to enjoy of the kids holding their "G" giraffe along with our stuffed classroom giraffes.

The children were also introduced to the fairy tale "Goldilocks and the Three Bears" which they really loved. We read it more than once since they liked it so much and they also enjoyed doing activities at playtime like a felt board story with Goldilocks and the Three Bears and also an activity where they had to put items according to size in three categories – large, medium, and small. These were items like the chairs, the bowls of porridge, the beds, etc. each in one of the three sizes. We even used big deep papa bear voices for the big items, mama bear sounding voices for the medium size items and wee baby bear voices for the small items.

Our next letter "H" centered around the word "hibernation." The children learned about some of the animals that are getting ready to hibernate for the winter. We fed a stuffed bear some pretend food getting ready for hibernation in a game we played. Our class also enjoyed the books "Old Bear" and "Hibernation Station". We even went on a fun bear hunt! Our week with the letter "H" was concluded with putting the stuffed bear in a cave made from cardboard and the kids glued cotton balls on top for snow. Our bear will be soundly sleeping in there until spring.

Another important event for this month was honoring our veterans. The children have been learning the Pledge of Allegiance and practiced some songs that they sang at the program with the other school children for our veterans. They worked very hard and had great enthusiasm with the songs! The children also had another opportunity to sharpen their scissor skills by cutting patriotic paper strips that were glued on hearts to look like the American flag that were made as a "thank you" poster for the veterans. They then finished off the poster with gold star stickers. I was very proud of them!

Our month of November then continued with learning about the first Thanksgiving and how the Pilgrims and Native Americans joined together to give thanks. We had lots of Thanksgiving activities that helped the children learn their colors, their numbers and their letters. We did the Turkey Dance Freeze for some silly fun and talked a lot about what we are thankful for. We learned the letter "I" during this time and the children each held a tall wood block with the letter "I" on it and they completed the sentence "I am thankful for......holding the block like a microphone. Many, many times when the children named what they were thankful for they would say their moms and dads or grandmas and grandpas...and even brothers and sisters were mentioned. We also had fun reading "The Great Turkey Race" and "Bear Says Thanks." The Gospel reading at Wednesday mass was about the story with the 10 lepers who were healed by Jesus and only one leper came back to thank Jesus. This became a beautiful lesson for the children to learn that we should always be thankful and also always say thank you.

Thank you to parents and families, Mrs. Halvorsen, teachers and staff, and Fr. Alan and parishioners for all your support to help us accomplish the

mission for our school.

Religion: This month we have been able to bring up gifts for Mass. We enjoyed being able to be a part of the Mass!



I hope everyone had a nice Thanksgiving break! The kindergarten class made a list of everything they were thankful for. They came up with quite a few things! The kindergarteners have been helping the 4K students bring up the gifts in Mass. They seem to really enjoy helping the younger students!

In Reading, as we continue to meet new Superkids, we are reading about how the Superkids (we have already met) work together to solve problems! The students do a really great job blending sounds to read words!

In Math, we have completed our shapes unit. The students love pointing out the shapes they see in everyday things. For example, the clock is a circle, stop signs are octagons, etc. The students have also become very good at putting shapes together to make a new shape. (Putting two trapezoids together to make a hexagon). We have been practicing adding numbers together, this week we will start subtraction!

In Religion, we learned about Baptism. We learned that when someone is baptized they enter God's family. We also talked about all the things we are thankful for and how everything we have comes from God and we should give him thanks everyday!




















I hope everyone had a great

pretty creative disguises!

In Superkids, the students are learning about words that end in -er and -ed. They learned that when we add -er to the end of a verb or an action word that we change the word to one that's the name for a person who does that action. For example, help to helper. The students do a great job pointing these words out in their reading.

In Math, the students have been working on recognizing ten as a unit. They have learned that 10 ones makes a unit called ten. They also learned that a teen number is composed of a ten and some ones. They seemed to really enjoy using cubes to represent their 10 when showing a teen number! This week, we have started working on story problems with three addends!

While November does not have a lot of days of school, they days were sure full! Our Veterans Day Program, beginning to practice Christmas Program songs, STAR Testing and our Saint of the Month party are a few of the things we managed to get in along with all of our "regular" activities. December is another month with not so many days, but we look forwards to being busy with Advent activities.



## MEASURING UP!



In Math, we have been learning about measuring length. We started with straw pieces and discovered that having a standard unit of measurement is important. After that we used centimeter cubes and found that it is not so accurate for longer objects. Then we used rulers and meter sticks, making our measurements more accurate. Now we are exploring inches, feet, and yards, comparing them to the metric units. The photos show us using teamwork to measure strips of paper that represent the lengths of some larger reptiles.

### TURKEY ESCAPE!

Grades One and Two received a mission: to disguise a turkey to help it escape the dinner table at Thanksgiving. We had many creative turkeys including Connor's fox, Adie's unicorn, James' American eagle, Klayton's Kansas City Chief, Max's hunter, and Cooper's LA Ram. We are happy to report that all of our turkeys made it through Thanksgiving!

Along with learning and practicing our Veterans Day songs, we spent time reading lots of books including Twenty-one Steps about guarding the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Chester Nez and the Unbreakable Code about a Navajo code talker, and Rags: Hero Dog of WWI. Because we knew part of the presentation that the veterans were going to give would be about the Missing Man Table, we also read America's White Table to help us learn about the symbols of that beautiful tradition. Favorite seasons were the topic of poems, and we tried to avoid "said" as we got creative explaining what happened to Mr. Miller's hat.

All the St. John students did a marvelous job with the Veterans Day program, and we are on our way to performing a miracle....Miracle on Main Street, that is. The cast is hard at work learning their lines, and students have been showing great excitement for the songs! Thank you to staff and students for all the extra effort! The lyrics will be memorized in no time with a bit of practice everyday. We're looking forward to a great program on December 17.

We had a fun time sharing our how-to articles in demonstration form! We had students make a smoothie and an apple pie for us to eat!








