Along with winter comes cold and so indoor recess was the rule for a time then but we played indoor games, played with playdough, and made an art project.

We began the new year of learning with a review of the letters we already learned and then began our next letter which was the letter M. We had fun singing and doing some motions to a song about Fred the Moose who liked to drink juice in his bed. We are starting to learn a little bit about words that rhyme. We also made a fun project using the letter M that became the face of a moose and its antlers were made from the outline of their hands. They also were able to cut and glue with this project. 





# January Newsletter Grade Two

We recite the mission statement daily after morning prayer and pledge. In this week's newsletter, we challenge you to look for ways everyone at St. John the Baptist Catholic School works to live out our mission.

### THIS MONTH

In Math, we wrapped up our study of strategies to add and subtract 2-digit numbers. Klayton and Cooper like using base-ten blocks, and Max prefers lining the numbers up by place value. Next we are going to apply those strategies as we explore 3-digit numbers. On the phonics side of Superkids, we have been studying some more complicated consonant and vowel patterns with silent letters. While learning to become better readers is important, we really like Superkids because the stories contain "Lasting Lessons" about how we treat one another, behave, contribute, and act as good citizens of our classrooms and communities. This month we learned how important it is to respect our friends' ideas and opinions, even if they are different than ours. Sometimes we might even change our own opinions if we listen! We also saw that it is ok to be friends with someone from another team, even if we may have to play against them. Sometimes we see our competition as "the enemy" when they are just kids like us who like to play their game!

### TWISTED TALES

Another part of Superkids we really enjoy is Book Club. This month we read "Betsy Who Cried Wolf" which is a twist on the familiar "The Boy Who Cried Wolf" tale. Of course tales are written to teach a moral. The moral of the story fit right in with our Superkids lasting lessons this month-it is ok to be different and still be friends. During our time with first grade, we continued to explore some more twisted tales. We even had a surprise visit from Alexander T. Wolf, aka the Big Bad Wolf, who shared with us his version of the tale with the book "The True Story of the Three Little Pigs."

### LADYBUG WARRIORS

This month we spent some time reminding ourselves how precious everyone is in God's eyes as we talked about the March for Life that Mr. and Mrs. Martinez attended. We watched an animated video called "Skiff and AJ's Fantastic Voyage." In the video, inanimate objects Skiff (the incense boat) and AJ (the aspergillum) find out the amazing life of a baby before it is even born. From the video: You are 40 weeks older than you think! We also read "The Grouchy Ladybug" and learned how we can be Ladybug Warriors for Our Lady, the Blessed Virgin Mary, by praying that through her intercession all babies will be born happy, healthy, and holy. We hope all of you will join us by praying the "Hail Mary" every day!



We started out 2024 with Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton. We have been saying our Prayer for Students. 



# Middle School Subjects


Students continue to work hard in Math.
