


### Middle School Dance

### MARCH NEWS FOR 3K

A new month begins with learning the letter "S" and also with a fun week of celebrating Dr. Seuss and his silly books. We started our fun by reading the book "The Cat in the Hat" and learning about all his antics. We then made our own Cat in a Hat face masks and turned into seventeen little Cat in the Hats! Everyone worked hard painting and gluing and a little bit of scissor cutting until we had it all complete, bow tie and all. We continued the week hearing more Dr. Seuss books read by our guests Mrs. Halvorsen and Mr. Martinez. We snacked on green eggs and ham (pretzels with white chocolate and green M&M's) and also truffala treats. On Wednesday we heard the story entitled "Wacky Wednesday" where everything was all wacky in the town for the day. So on Friday we created "Wacky Friday" and the 3K students dressed wacky such as mismatched shoes and socks, clothes backwards or inside out, or just silly things we wore. To the children's surprise the 3K classroom was also wacky and the Cat in the Hat was up to no good in their room overnight. They found stuffed animals in their seats, socks and boots on table and chair legs, boots hanging from the ceiling, toys a mess, and things upside down. They were delighted and excited! Would our room ever be back to normal again?

To the children's disappointment they did find the classroom back to normal the next week but we moved on to learn about St. Patrick and the special day celebrating him. We painted shamrocks with rolling pins wrapped in bubble wrap and green paint and learned about the Trinity which begins with our newest letter "T".

We also continued our journey through Lent and each day put a sticker on a path that leads to Easter.

In the days to follow came the first day of Spring even though our weather didn't represent it well. The time had finally come for our hibernating bear to come out of his den that he had been sleeping in all winter. First we heard the story "Old Bear" about a bear in hibernation who dreams of spring. Then after a countdown our bear came out from his cardboard cave much to the children's excitement.

Our final week before Spring break vacation was focused on learning about Holy Week. Each of the children worked together to form two palm branches created from their handprints and we talked about Palm Sunday. We continued our study about Holy Week with Easter stories and learning about Jesus' Last Supper with His apostles, His dying on the cross, and then put into the tomb. But they also learned that even though this was sad, the good news is that Jesus rose from the dead and is alive! Each of these events are on display on the bulletin board in our hallway and when the children come back after Spring break they will find a picture of Jesus outside the tomb in His glory.

We also had some fun before break coloring eggs and painting them with markers. The children were very proud of their creations.



Phonics- The sight words have been the biggest thing we have been working on this month. We have talked about can, see, to, a, I, and now the.


Math- We have continued working on our 10-20 numbers. They have been working very hard with these and I am beyond proud of all of them.

We are starting swimming coming up in April for our students. They are very excited




In Religion, the students are making Holy Week books. They are learning what happened each day during Holy week and making a handprint to represent each day. For example, when they learned about Palm Sunday and Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, they made a handprint of a palm branch to represent the palms that were waved during His entry. In Social Studies, the students learned about timelines. The students learned how to read a timeline and were able to make a few timelines of their own. They made a timeline of the months of the year. They had to write down all of the months and then place pictures representing different holidays on their timelines!

In Superkids, the first graders are continuing to read and learn different reading rules. They have been learning about adjectives and comparing them. They have also been decoding words that end in -y -ier and - iest. They continue to learn new sight words, and seem to enjoy playing sight word memory match!

In Math, the first grade has been learning about solid shapes. They have been dividing shapes into two and four equal parts. They then learned that if there were two equal parts it is called halves and if there are four it is called fourths. They are getting very quick at their addition and subtraction skills. We will continue dividing shapes into equal parts. The students will learn that dividing a shape into more equal parts creates smaller pieces.

In the month of March, we celebrated Read Across America Week, Dr. Seuss's birthday, and we also had the opportunity to pet baby sheep!






## Classroom News



### 5th/6th Grade Newsletter



## This Month In 7/8 Homeroom









