


August 10th is a big day in Edgar as there will be a Car Show, Chalk Fest and we will be there with face painting and lemonade.



MOMS ARE SPECIAL

A new month began and the first week we talked about how wonderful our moms are and all the things they do that make us feel loved and we made a special gift for them for Mother's Day. We also learned about the Blessed Mother Mary and how Jesus said she is our spiritual mother and we honor her too. We talked about the rosary and we began learning the "Hail Mary" prayer each morning. We also enjoyed the books, "Does a Kangaroo Have a Mother?" and "Are you My Mother?".

OUR COMMUNITY

In May we also learned about our community and some of the people who help us. We went to visit the Edgar Public Library where the librarian read a story and showed us around the library. We talked about being able to borrow books to look at and then returning them back to the library. Along with the library we learned about the Post Office and how a letter goes in the mailbox and travels to the person we send it to. Other community members we talked about throughout the month were the dentist, doctor, fire fighters and police officers and found out more about their jobs and how they help us.

OUR FIVE SENSES

Our class also studied about our five senses, what each one does, and how awesome God is to give us these unique senses. We discovered through books how animals use their senses and how different God made some of them. For example, it was funny to learn that a butterfly tastes with it's legs and a snake smells with it's tongue.

SHOW AND TELL

Another fun thing we did was a week of "Show and Tell." We split in 3 groups and each of the students took turns over the three school days in the week to bring in something from home that they wanted to show and tell about. It was a great opportunity for each student to be able to talk in front of the group and share about something that is special to them. The

other students then had the chance to say something about what someone brought or ask a question. The 3K kids don't quite understand the concept of what a question is yet so mostly they just said how much they loved the item or the color or something else about it. It was good practice for them to learn to listen while someone else speaks, raising our hands when we want a turn to speak, and waiting our turn.

SCHOOL PICNIC

We were all looking forward to the school picnic and even though we didn't get to go to the park as planned because of the weather we still had fun being with our families and even getting a chance to play outside when the rain stopped for awhile.

OUR NAMES ARE SPECIAL

Our names are special and especially for 3K students because that is the first thing they recognize when they are learning the alphabet, is their own name. We ended the school year with some art projects that highlighted their names. First, we did a wax resist project where we painted with watercolors to reveal our name that was written with a white crayon. The children were delighted to see their names appear on the white paper. Since it is springtime, we also made our own paper robin's nest with ripped brown construction paper and filled with blue paper eggs. Each of the student's nest contained the number of eggs coordinating with the number of letters in their names and they had to glue them in the correct order to spell their name. They turned out as beautiful as a nest full of real bird eggs!

DANDELIONS ARE BEAUTIFUL in the EYES of a CHILD

Our final art project was a paper dandelion. The children enjoyed picking dandelions from the grass during recess and would come in with handfuls of dandelions to give to their moms or others. They were so proud of their bouquets!! Of course, the dandelions probably were drooped and shriveled before they reached a vase at home but I hope all you moms enjoyed the loving thought. So, I thought since the kids loved the dandelions so much, we would make a paper version that would stand straight and tall with its beautiful yellow splendor for a while longer than the real "flower." The kids were pretty pleased to have one more dandelion to take home.

Our school year now comes to a close and I would like to take this opportunity to say "thank you" to everyone who made this year so wonderful for our class. 
With Grade One






ELA and Religion





Middle School Subjects





We hope moms enjoyed their blossom cards or paintings and the rose magnet/pins.




